#### MFMBFRSHIP TYPFS

Regular (\$100 annually): Physician oncologist specialists who are actively practicing in Hawaii and U.S. Associated Pacific Territories.

Group (\$400 annually per group of four physicians): Physicians in a hospital, academic, or group practice who meet Regular membership requirements. Additional physicians who meet the requirements may join at \$75 each. Each group may enroll up to five support (non-physician) staff as associate members free of charge. Additional support staff may join at \$25 each.

Associate (\$25 annually): Allied health professionals who are interested or involved in the care of patients with cancer.

Member-in-Training (complimentary): Healthcare professionals participating in approved oncology or hematology subspecialty training or any student interested in hematology-oncology and is sponsored by an active member.

Retired (complimentary): Retired oncologists will enjoy clinical updates and collaborative opportunities at local events.







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
